**Driving Under the Influence (DUI); Driving While Intoxicated (DWI);
Operating While Impaired (OWI) Education Programs:**

Individuals arrested in the District of Columbia for a misdemeanor traffic offense are generally assigned to a period of probation supervision by the Court Services & Offender Supervision Agency's (CSOSA) Traffic Alcohol Program (TAP).

The TAP Supervision Unit is located at:

Individuals placed under TAP supervision must successfully fulfill special reporting conditions that include: participation and completion of a certified Alcohol Education Program; remain alcohol free (TAP tests for alcohol use); and attend Victims Impact Panel (VIP) classes.

Note: CSOSA offers alcohol education programs to unemployed probationers at no cost.

If the individual is employed CSOSA will refer the individual to a fee for service course. Depending on the provider, course cost range from \$240 to \$880. Average length per course is 3 months.

In addition to completing an alcohol education program TAP supervision generally requires the probationer to attend special Victim Impact and Traffic Safety Programs.
