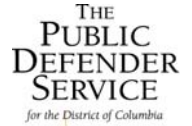

ESSAY PORTION OF APPLICATION

The following fact pattern is designed to help the selection committee identify candidates who have the potential to be good defense investigators; that is, to find those who are creative, who have excellent writing skills and an eye for detail, and who have the basic skills to handle such an independent, people oriented job. You will need to attach your own paper to this application form. Please make sure that each page has your name and the correct page number.

Fact Pattern

Our client, Rodney Banks, was arrested and accused of armed robbery. Mr. Banks is 20 years old, 6'2", 180 pounds and walks with a pronounced limp. Mr. Banks lives at 1701 Bay St. SE in Washington, DC. Mr. Banks was wearing blue jeans, a white t-shirt, a gray sweatshirt, and black boots at the time he was arrested.

The document given at the time of client's presentment consists of the following information.

On 2/9/07 at approximately 8:30am, the complainant, James Wilson, reported to the Metropolitan Police Department that he was robbed. The complainant stated that he was walking on 17th St. SE toward Eastern Sr. High School when he heard someone yell, "Hey, wait up!" The complainant looked back to see who had yelled, but he did not recognize the person so he continued to walk. According to the complainant, the defendant ran up to him and began to walk beside him. The defendant said, "Give me your coat." The complainant replied, "Whatever." The defendant stopped walking and said, "Give me your coat or I will kill you." The complainant said that he stopped walking and turned around to face the defendant who was aiming a gun at his face. The complainant gave his coat (a black North Face ski jacket) to the defendant. The defendant put his gun in his pants and ran away. The complainant ran to school and immediately reported the incident to the principal, who then called the police. When two MPD officers arrived, the complainant explained what happened and described the person that stole his jacket as a tall and thin man with a medium complexion wearing a gray hooded sweatshirt, dark pants, and black Nike boots. The officers canvassed the area and found someone matching the description given by the complainant. A show-up identification was conducted and the complainant positively identified the defendant as the person who stole his jacket. The defendant was arrested based on the show-up identification by the complainant.

Our client, Mr. Banks, denies any knowledge of the incident. He claims that he was at the Safeway on 14th and E St. SE with his girlfriend at the time the incident occurred. Mr. Banks said that he was arrested while he was walking to his neighbor's house to pick up his son.

Provide a theory of defense and an explanation of what the defense could say happened. What reasons can you find to explain why the complainant (c/w) may have identified your client as the suspect in this case? What kinds of evidence would seem to support or contradict each one of these reasons?

Outline the steps you would take to investigate the case for the defense*. Please keep in mind that in the District of Columbia, the defense is only entitled to a basic police report with the name and address of the complaining witness. Specify who you would interview, how you would find them, and what questions you would ask them? What documents, other than the police report, would you need to examine during your investigation? Please include any other investigative steps you would take to get as much information as possible about this incident.

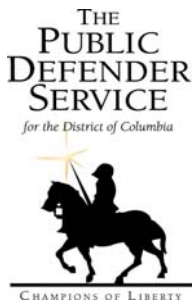

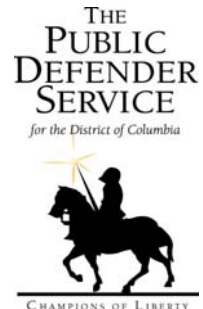
